A dry, powdered substance made of burned limestone and clay that is baked at a high temperature. When mixed with water and aggregate, it hardens into concrete.



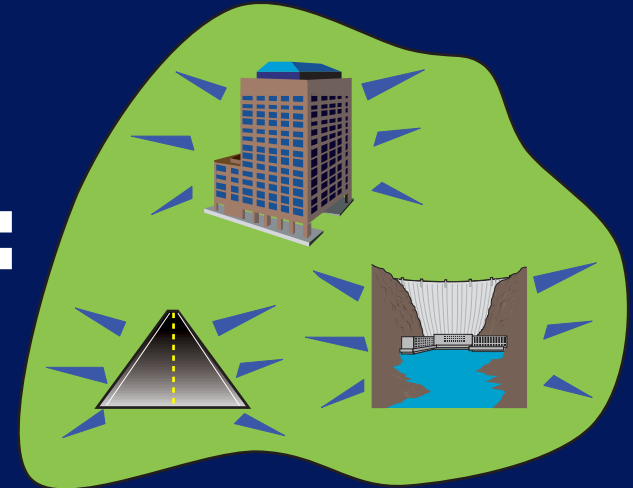
